The school that we started at the hospital in Chad this January with 35 students, now has increased to 220 students! There are students there from at least four Muslim tribes. More than one half of the students are girls. The latter opportunity is not so common in certain areas. The Lord is blessing!

Still we request your prayers for our team in Chad as there are certain aggressive parties who are against the school ministry.

They all feel ready and excited at the prospect of working for the Kingdom at the CEF hospital in Guinebor II near N'Djamena, Chad. The Hotchkin family plans to start serving with CEF in Chad in January 2010.
